
The format was based on an Order of Worship drawn up by Edward White Bensen, later Archbishop of Canterbury, for Christmas Eve, 1880, in Truro, Cornwall (England). It has been adapted and used by other churches all over the world. Numerous Christian churches have adopted this service, or a variation of this service, as part of their Christmas and Epiphany celebrations.
