A Hungry and Thirsty Soul

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness for they will be filled.

Several years ago Pat, my mother -in-law, sold her home and moved to an assisted living complex. She chose a few things to keep and the rest she gave away. Her home was filled with a life-time collection of things. When asked about the keepsakes she said, "I no longer need these things." Our needs change!

Several months later, Andrea and Donna, her sister, were with Pat after surgery. Even though she was in a "regular" room, things were not going well. Andrea called me. I heard the panic in her voice. "Tell me what you see happening to your mother," I said. "Have you pushed the "call button?" "Yes, we have pushed it twice but no one has come." "Andrea, you must immediately go to the nurses station and demand that a nurse come now."

A few minutes passed. Andrea called. She reported the nurse saying that her "demand" saved her mother's life. Sometimes, the measure of medication used to treat the general population is enough to overdose and kill an individual. The nurse immediately recognized what had happened, gave Pat a shot, and Pat's vital signs returned to normal.

Days later Pat called to tell me about her experience of being unconscious. She spoke of her fear. She described the darkness. She talked about crying out for help. Then, she shared a story I have heard many times. Pat heard a voice. The voice said, "Do not worry. Everything is ok. I am with you."

Did God speak to Pat? Did Pat hear the still small voice of God? Was the voice she heard the same voice that led Abraham to the Promised Land? Did Noah, Isaac, Jacob, and Paul hear this voice? Can you hear this voice also?

I am convinced that God speaks to everyone. God is Spirit! The "poor in spirit" have eyes but cannot see God. The "poor in spirit" have ears but cannot hear God. We want to avoid pain in favor of pleasure, but grief and mourning visit and over time swallow us whole. The flu or common cold does not have this power. Hearing the "C" word does! For others the "D" word, divorce turns into a Holy Spirit led journey into death and resurrection. God wakes some people in "mid-life crisis." Others wake up when they reach the bottom of addiction. Still others have an experience like Pat's.

Jesus says the "poor in spirit" and those who "mourn" are blessed. Experience gives me wisdom to say that my poverty in spirit and mourning resonate with God's healing wake up calls. My poor spirit and grief, yes, especially dark depression, opened the eyes and ears of my soul to hear the Spirit of God leading me into the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth as it is in Heaven!

We build a nest we call home. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Noah, and Paul left the safety of their nest to satisfy their hunger and thirst for righteousness. Maslow and others explain that our basic human needs must be met before we may take the inward journey, the spiritual journey, into our soul! I am blessed by Pat, and countless others, who have showed me the way through the things of this world, nest building, to recognize what Jesus calls the soul's "hunger and thirst for righteousness."

I am a voice crying in the wilderness; a witness that God is with us; and if us, then you. Listen to your soul!
