Each kit consists of a backpack and school supplies such as paper, erasers, pencils, pens, and an English Dictionary. The total cost of these items was \$237. The money used to purchase these items came from the NOW Team fund and you are welcome to designate money to this account at any time.

United Methodist Men—Our next UMM meeting is scheduled for Tuesday June 6th at 7 pm. All men are invited to attend this meeting.

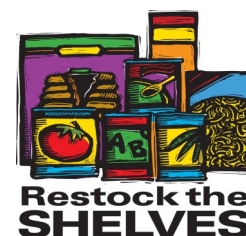
