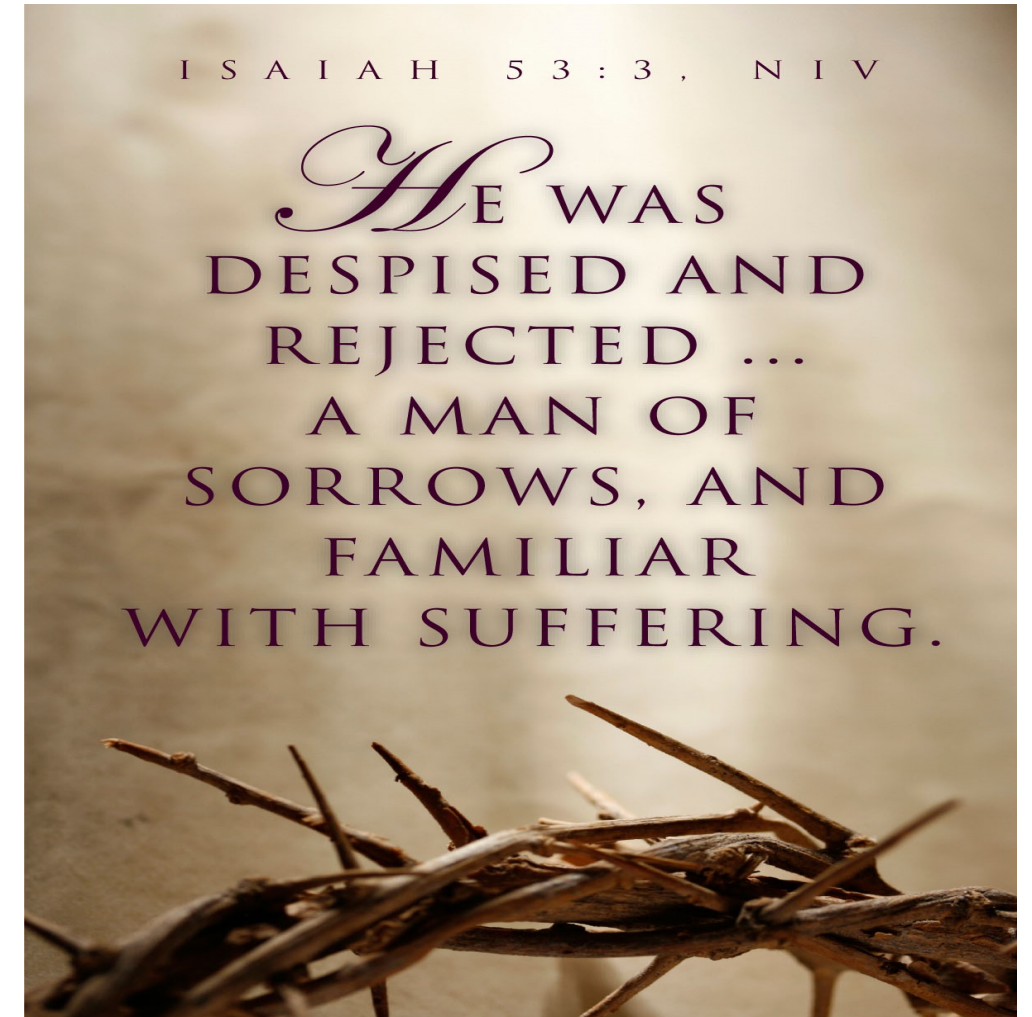

Father, Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ.
By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you

We know about Baptism in water. How was Jesus Baptized in suffering, death, and resurrection?

Listen to the Prophet Isaiah describe how Jesus immersed Himself into our lives.

(Stand as able! The Lector reads Isaiah 53: 3-6)
