Hard copies are delivered by mail and/or volunteers each week. You may find back issues on Trinity's website. Your pastor continues to post weekly sermons on his Facebook Page and Trinity's website. Virtual Bible and Discipleship classes are offered on Zoom. Devotions are sent via Dial My Calls most Mondays, Wednesday's, and Fridays. Martha Spurlock connects the congregation to one another and the community through a emailed prayer list.

John Wesley offers Three Simple Rules:

- 1. Do no Harm.
- 2. Do Good.
- 3. Stay in Love with God.

I hear Jesus teaching us that when our thoughts, words, and actions do harm we Curse our neighbor, self, and community.

I hear Jesus teach the Good we are to do is to bless those who curse us.

I hear Jesus teach that the Holy Spirit opens our eyes to see suffering and death as opportunities to stay in Love with God.

The Attached PDF is the culmination of my longing to worship in Spirit and Truth. This Vision of Worship rose up out of prayer, Bible study, meditation, and many months of "spiritual discontent". With our eyes opened the Holy Spirit leads us to let suffering and evil be. Only then do we experience God with us in our suffering healing the affections created by evil.

My hope is that our opinions lead us to bless one another, not curse or resort to evil filled with anger, wrath, malice, gossip, name calling and defensing our self imposed Labels!
