There are a couple sets of keys missing from the box in the office. The primary set that is being looked for is the outside storage keys. Please return to the church office ASAP.


Administrative Board

Growing Up in Christ Part 4

In today's reading from Matthew 8, we come face to face with three of humankind's greatest fears. Jesus gives orders for his followers to go over to the other side. Second, by virtue of becoming his Disciples he tells us we have no place to lay our heads. Finally, he confronts us with death. "Let the dead bury the dead!"

To follow Jesus, the scribe will have to go over to the other side. In other words, he must become Jesus' disciple. Disciples cross over into the world to bring the mercy, love, and grace of God. Jesus' Disciples, therefore, fulfill the Law. They love their neighbors, especially their enemies. The scribe is a disciple of the Pharisees. Jesus told us in the Sermon on the mount that His disciple's righteousness must exceed that of the Pharisees and Scribes. Believing love is greater than all our sin gets us started. Crossing over into the world to offer Jesus requires faith and hope.

Therefore, the scribe has a place to lay his head. He kept the Law of Moses but added doctrines too heavy to carry. For example, the Law required the leper to live in exile. He was required to cover his mouth and shout unclean, unclean whenever he came near another person. The Pharisees added to the Law. They required the leper to cry out when they were 60 feet from a person. In other words, their doctrines did not offer mercy that flowed from the love Paul describes in I Corinthians 13.

Jesus says, "Blessed are you when you are persecuted for righteousness sake." Jesus welcomed the leper. He choose to make the leper clean. He even reached out his hand and touched the leper. Jesus offered the same mercy and love to the Centurion and Peter's mother-in-law. Ultimately, Jesus is crucified for his display of mercy and love. The Kingdom of Heaven is a threat to the oppression of the world.

Students of the Law learn from an early age that the penalty of sin is death. Herein death is spiritual, emotional, and judgmental. The soul that cannot hear and follow the Holy Spirit is dead in sin. The dead heart is cold, hard, and guided by fear expressed as shame, guilt, and blame. Judgment and condemnation flow from the mind of people dead in sin. Jesus' words sound very harsh. He says, "Let the dead bury the dead." Friends, look around! We bury one another in judgement, condemnation, division, and hate.

Jesus shows us the truth about tough love. He crosses over to the other side. He came from heaven to earth. He is the King of Kings who brings the Kingdom of Heaven into the world. He who is Holy chooses to touch the very people religion counts as dead, or enemies, or possessions. The leper was counted as dead. The Centurion was Israel's enemy. Peter's mother-in-law, like all women, was judged to be a possession like cattle.

Not much as changed! The same Spirit that led Jesus seeks a heart, soul, and mind to bring the Kingdom of Heaven to earth.
