Some Thoughts from the Pastor...

Grace and Peace to you this Christmas. It's been a while since I actually wrote one of these columns. I have a few things I need to share. First of all, as to my health. I will be undergoing surgery on January 5th to repair damage to my wrist caused by the fall last April. It is not resolving on its own and the doctor says that this is the best way to relieve the pain and soreness that I am experiencing. I will be in a splint/cast for about 6 weeks and then need to undergo more therapy on the wrist. I continue to build strength in the left knee, but am still not back to where I was prior to the accident.

Secondly, I will be moving my office to the parsonage basement as I recover from the surgery. I will be unable to come down the stairs at church, since I will not be able to grasp the rail with my right hand. I can get up to the office, but would not want to venture back down the stairs on a regular basis.

Thirdly, some of you may have noticed a moldy/mildew smell in the fellowship hall area. The Trustees are addressing this issue. We think it is from moisture in the basement. Please bear with us as we seek to resolve this situation.

Fourthly, the Administrative Board met this past week and approved a budget for 2017. The increase was less than 1 percent over 2016. Our biggest increase came from higher anticipated insurance rates. Copies will be available in the church office on January 1st.

Finally, at the Administrative Board meeting, we discussed our year end giving. Our church has traditionally been one that waits until the last few Sundays of the year to sort of catch up. We are hoping that this will be the same this year. Over the last three years, we have received an average of about \$20,000 in December. It would be great if we could once again do that this year. For the first two Sundays of December, we have received about \$9,000 towards that total. If we could receive the remaining \$11,000 then we would be able to finish the year at approximately the same level we began the year. Our dream goal, however, would be \$16,000 by years end. This would put us in the best financial situation that we have had in several years. So, if you were wondering if we need that extra year end gift from you—the answer is YES. We do. So please give generously as we close out 2016 and prepare to begin 2017.

A Reading for the Fourth Sunday of Advent-LOVE (Luke 2: 1-14)

2 In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: 11 to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

One: Elizabeth did not know why Mary came rushing through her doors, but the leap of her unborn child filled her with the knowledge of the Lord. The knowledge of the Lord filled her with peace.

All: May the light of Christ fill us with peace.

(Light the candle of PEACE)

One: John the Baptist, while in the womb of his mother, expressed the joy of generations to come. The faith of Mary filled the unborn babe with joy.

All: May the light of Christ fill us with joy.

(Light the candle of JOY)

One: In a moment filled with hope, in a moment filled with peace, in a moment filled with joy, Mary opened her mouth to sing, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior..." Mary rejoices in the God who loves the oppressed; Mary rejoices in the God who loves the hungry. Mary a maiden, Mary unseen by the powerful of the world, is filled with the light and made powerful by a God bent on overturning the world with a teenage girl and newborn babe.

All: Like the first disciple Mary, let the light of Christ fill us with love.

(Light the candle of LOVE)

One: Please join me in prayer.

All: God of Love, we thank you for bringing the light of Christ into the world. May the love shared by Elizabeth and Mary serve as a beacon for our own affections. May we, like Mary, create love that exalts the lowly and makes low the proud. May we all bear the light that changes the world. Amen.
